OUR COLLEGE

"Education is the movement from darkness to light". Shri Shahu Mandir Mahavidyalaya is started with the intention of spreading the light of education among the disadvantaged section of society. Education is made available to the poorest of the poor. Thus, our motto is "Bahujan Hitaya Bahujan Sukhaya". i.e. for the well-being and happiness of the masses. Through education we try to inculcate the culture of social equality, education and upliftment of the poor.

Shri Shahu Mandir Mahavidyalaya is a branch of Akhil Bharatiya Maratha Shikshan Parishad, an educational trust established in 1907 with the objective to cater to the academic needs of the poor and the needy, particularly with a rural background. The A.B.M.S. Parishad celebrated its centenary in 2007. Looking back upon the past the Parishad feels proud of its achievements and fulfilment of its commitment to society. Shri Shahu Mandir Mahavidyalaya indeed has the honour of being one of the most flourishing branches of this socially committed institution and holds its head high for pursuing the social goals of the A.B.M.S. Parishad. Inspired by the thoughts and actions of Shahu Maharaj, the trustees established this college in 1960 appropriately named after the noble king who spent all his life in the cause of social equality, education and upliftment of the poor.

It is great honour for us, that the then Prime Minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru laid the foundation stone of the main building of our college in 1959. Having completed 60 years of academic service to society today we have a three storey main building with an adequate number of class-rooms, laboratories, common rooms, a separate library building and meticulously developed flora over a piece of more than 65 acres at the foot of the Parvati hill. We have competent and well-qualified teaching faculty and an excellent administrative tradition.

Our college was honoured for its significant role in "spreading higher education amongst the most disadvantaged sections of society" by NAAC in 2003. In 2011 again our contribution to education and social upliftment through education to the masses impressed the NAAC Team and we secured Grade 'A'. In the forth cycle of reaccreditation of NAAC we again have secured the "A" Grade in the academic year of 2022-2023. OUR HIGHLIGHTS

With a view to achieve our vision of empowering the economically, socially and academically backward students through quality and value-based education, we have introduced various short-term courses. We have made considerable infrastructural development of the college. We have more classrooms in the extended building, a better and computerised administration section, a very well furnished Ladies' Hostel and a new Administrative Building of the ABMS Parishad. A new well equipped gymnasium has also been set up for staff, students and outsiders. For the enhancement of competence and self-dependency of our students, we have competitive Examination Centre, Placement Cell, Entrepreneurship Development Cell, Language Laboratory, Equal Opportunity Centre etc.

RAJARSHI SHAHU ACADEMY

In par with the changing scenario of competition in all walks of life, our students along with traditional degree courses need to be equipped with skills that will enable them to face the life challenges. Thus with inspiration and guidance of our visionary leader and President of Akhil Bhartiya Maratha Shikshan Parishad, Honourable Sharadrao Pawar, our institution started the Rajarshi Shahu Academy. This Academy provides training, guidance consultancy and job opportunities through various vocational short and long term courses with minimum fees. Academy provides reading hall with sufficient facilities for the students preparing for competitive examinations.



COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION CENTRE

Our college has a well-organised Competitive Examination Centre initiated by the A.B.M.S. Parishad. The CEC offers guidance to students who wish to appear for various Competitive Examinations conducted by the U.P.S.C., M.P.S.C., R.R.B., Staff Selection Commission, IBPS, Police & Talathi Bharti etc.

The centre provides a sound foundation and orientation in natural and social sciences so as to enable the candidates to get through various entrance, preliminary and main examinations. The centre has its own library with a variety of books on various competitive Examination.

LIBRARY

Library is Heart of any educational institute. It plays a vital role in the education of students for their overall development. Shri Shahu Mandir Mahavidyalaya has a separate building of Library. It has very rich and rare collection of books and periodicals with Automation of all its functions. This year Library Building is extended by adding third floor, which will be utilized in creation of Digital library, Institutional Repository and Reference section. Total Collection of library including syllabus books, reference books and reference material as such encyclopedias, Dictionaries etc. is 53,00 & total Periodicals in the current year are 70 including National & International. It has Multimedia collection of CDs, Cassettes. Library makes



available daily reading of 14 different Newspapers. Library Circulation timing is from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., & reading hours extended to 9 p.m. during exams. It has two separate reading halls for girls & boys. Library runs UGC Scheme & Earn & Learn Scheme every year. Library has subscribed of N-list Database for faculties and students doing research which includes access to E-journals, articles, books etc. Special Library Services includes ISSUE OF I - CARDS (On the day of admission), Display of new arrival of Periodicals and Books on board, Display of Newspaper Articles related to competitive exams and career based or special articles for inspiration and encouragement of students. Display of Suvichar, Dinivshesh on notice Board, OPAC, Lending of General books on twice a week, Special awards to student (Best Reader) who maximum access library.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Discipline and excellence in sports are special features of our College. Our students have maintained the tradition of getting prizes and awards in sports at University, State and National Levels. A well equipped Gymnasium is used not only by our sportsmen but all our students for their fitness. We offer all students access to advanced training and premium facilities for cricket, tennis, basketball, Athletes, Volley Ball and Kabbadi



NATIONAL CADET CORPS (N.C.C.) FOR BOYS AND GIRLS

The college has an N.C.C. unit consisting of boys and girl unit attached to 36 Maharashtra Battalion with 1 platoon and a strength of 50 cadets.

Enrolment in N.C.C. is done through selection in the first week of July.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.)

The college also implements the National Service Scheme. Around 200 students are enrolled in this scheme. They are expected to engage themselves in social work for minimum 120 hours in regular N.S.S. activities. They also have to attend an annual special camp of 7 days in rural areas. Various activities under this scheme expose students to social reality inspiring them to serve society and make towards it whatever little contribution they can.



AUTONOMOUS SHORT-TERM COURSES

The college conducts need-based short-term courses in Computer studies, Fruit Processing, processed Fruit Preservation, Gardening, Nursery, Tally Accounting etc. The teachers of Horticulture conduct a course in "Fruits & Vegetable Processing & Preservation". Theoretical & practical training in making products like various fruit Jams, Orange, Wood Apple and Guava Jelly, Orange Marmalade, various types of Squash, Syrups, Ketchups & Pickles is given. Such courses are conducted on demand & availability of sufficient candidates.

Admissions to these courses are open to all students and even outsiders. Announcements of such courses are made through advertisements, posters and notices displayed on our notice-boards.

The college has introduced self-supporting short-term courses in Flower Arrangement, Basic Beauty Culture, Tally, Aari Work, Jewellery Making, Spoken English, A I Course and so on.



COMPUTER LABORATORY

For the students to be well equipped in information technology and computer literate we have computer laboratory with adequate facilities :

- Computer Laboratory as per prescribed specifications
- Main Server and 19 nodes with the latest configurations & necessary software and accessories.
- A Separate class-room with a Computer and an L.C.D. Projector for online teaching.
- Adequate number of required instruments and free access to students.
- Broad Band Connection for Internet.



OTHER NEED-BASED COURSES

We offer a course in Information Technology in our Junior Wing. With the advent of Information Technology (IT) Revolution communication has come to assume different connotations. At the click of the Mouse we can open the Gates of Knowledge. The college promises to play a crucial role in generating requisite technical man-power in Information Technology to meet the national goals of economic development and social transformation. Information Technology is considered as an effective means of social transformation if it is widely used. We, therefore, have strengthened our IT Wing.

We have introduced some Vocational Courses in Information Technology like MS-CIT, Tally Package of Accounting etc.

BOARD OF EXTRA MURAL STUDIES

The college runs a Centre of the Extra Mural Activities of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune which organises extension programmes as per the university guidelines. A lecture series on various topics is organised every year for our students.

PUBLIC SPEAKING FORUM

We have a 'Public Speaking Forum'. The purpose behind it is to make students shed their feelings of inferiority and nervousness in general social interaction and enhance their communication skills, make them feel more self-confident, make them disciplined and organised and thus help them to achieve all round development.

CAREER GUIDANCE CENTRE & PLACEMENT CELL

The college runs a career guidance centre and placement cell which organise placement seminars and lectures on career avenues for the benefit of students. Many of our students avail themselves of the activities of this cell and get employment and guidance for career and employment through the cell.

PH.D. RESEARCH CENTER (COMMERCE)

Ph.D. Research Center in Commerce has started from the academic year 2016-17 which is approved by Government of Maharashtra and affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University. As of now, there are 20 guides associated to the research center and 77 students are doing their research in the Centre. Students who completed Post Graduation i.e. M.Com or M.Phil in commerce along with other qualification norms prescribed by University can take admission for the Ph.D. Course.

Board of Student Development Cell

EARN AND LEARN SCHEME

Considering the nature and need of our students we have introduced the Earn And Learn scheme in our college. Needy students participating in this scheme are expected to work for certain number of hours in the college office / library etc. and make an earning so as to enable themselves to continue and complete their education.



STUDENTS' AID FUND:

The College has a Students' Aid Fund to support meritorious students belonging to economically backward section of the society. Students desiring to avail this fund shall have to apply to the principal with supporting documents.

LANGUAGE LAB

The College has a well-equipped language lab with software assistance for students to have training in English language in both writing and speaking skills. The Lab offers a Certificate Course in Spoken and Written English. Workshops on English Communication Skills are also conducted.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College was constituted as per the directive of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The IQAC initiates various measures for the holistic development of the College. To ascertain the improvement of the academic ambience, the IQAC coordinates with the College administration and different cells and clubs. Annual reports are prepared and uploaded by the IQAC with approval from the Governing body of the College. It also takes feedback from the stakeholders of the College on different aspects of teaching-learning process. The feedback process helps in improving the overall quality of the College. IQAC also organizes workshops and other academic programmes for the faculty members and non-teaching staff of the College.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The College has a Grievance Redressal Cell constituted with the teachers, students of the College and an ombudsperson in campus and outside of the college to look into the complaints on various issues that might arise in the campus. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the Convener or the members of the Grievance Cell either in person or through a letter, both online and offline. Any such complaints when reported are promptly addressed.

HOSTEL

The College has two hostels, one each for boys and girls respectively. The Hostels are situated at just 200 metres away from the main Academic Campus. There is a hostel committee to look after the smooth functioning of the hostels. The management of the hostels is strictly supervised by the resident superintendents. The hostels provide all the necessary basic facilities to its boarders. The hostels maintain a policy of zero tolerance towards ragging and any form of harassment.

A) Boys' Hostel

The college has a well equipped boys' hostel on the campus with a capacity of about 145 students. Hostel accommodation is moderately charged. Students seeking hostel accommodation have to apply separately. Any misuse of the hostel accommodation invites strict disciplinary action.



B) Girls' Hostel

The newly built, well furnished Girls' Hostel on our campus has the capacity to accommodate 100 students. Girls seeking hostel accommodation have to apply separately and once admitted have to strictly abide by the rules. Girls in the hostel can have their meals at the hostel mess only. Hostel accommodation is moderately charged.



Hostel Rules:

The boarders of the hostels must abide by the following hostel rules:

- There shall be no ragging in the Hostels.
- Anybody found indulging in any behaviour or act that may be constituted as Ragging under Clause 4 of the UGC regulations is liable to be expelled from the Hostel as well as the College.
- Every boarder of the Hostel shall have to strictly follow the timings of breakfast, lunch, dinner, study hour and evening roll calls. All the boarders have to take their meals/breakfast in the dining hall itself and under no circumstances the boarders will be allowed to take away meals/breakfast from the dining hall to their room.
- During study hours, no boarders should remain outside without the permission from the Superintendent. Loitering and gossiping in other's room during study hours will be treated as punishable offence.
- Any type of abuse (alcohol/drugs/smoking etc.) shall lead to outright expulsion from the Hostels.
- Leave of absence from the Hostel must be applied in advance to the Superintendent through the hostel Monitor. The Superintendent reserves the right to accept or reject the same.
- No outsider should be allowed to enter during the study hours or College hours. No guests should be entertained to stay in the Hostel. Violation of the same will invite disciplinary action.
- A Hostel boarder may be asked to vacate the hostel by the Hostel authority at any point of time on the grounds of indiscipline and misconduct towards the authority, co-boarders, employees of the hostel etc. without any prior notice.

- Moreover, if a boarder is expelled from the College on any ground he/she will be automatically expelled from the hostel also. After expulsion, such boarder will not be allowed to enter the hostel premises for any purpose.
- College Hostel will remain closed during Summer Vacation and Winter Vacation .No boarder will be allowed to reside in the hostel in any private capacity.
- A hostel boarder will have to vacate his/her hostel seat immediately after the final examination.
- The Superintendent maintains a conduct register. In the event of any violation of hostel rules, the boarders are liable to be punished and have their names entered in the register for misconduct.
- Admission to the hostel is valid only for one academic session (not exceeding one year). The hostel Superintendent reserves the right to readmit a boarder for the next session taking the conduct and activities of the concerned boarder into consideration. Moreover, the attendance of a boarder in the College should be more than 75% while getting readmission to the hostel.
- If a boarder commit any unlawful activity that may be damaging the reputation of the College/Hostel authorities and as well as detrimental to the student/deponents during the stay in the hostel premises, the College/Hostel authorities shall not be held responsible and shall not be accordable in any way in this connection.
- Using of electric appliances like heater, Iron, oven etc. are strictly prohibited in the rooms of the hostel boarders. The Fans, bulbs and the tube lights should be switched off when not in use.

SWIMMING POOL

We also have on our campus a Swimming Pool of the size 80X40 feet with a well-equipped filtration plant. It is managed by the Akhil Bharatiya Maratha Shikshan Parishad. The Management has appointed experienced and expert coaches. There are separate batches for students and the staff of the college. Our students and staff are given a concession of 50% in the charges for the use of the pool



ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Alumni of our college have established their registered Association. This Association actively functions in our college. The alumni have, till date, encouraged, supported and organised various programmes in college. They continue to extend their unconditional co-operation and help in conducting & developing various programmes in our college. Students who pass out from our college can join this Association.

GROUP INSURANCE COVER FOR STUDENTS

Board of Students' Welfare, University of Pune has introduced this scheme for students of senior college. Under this scheme every student pays Rs. 10/- towards his/her insurance. The risk cover includes accidental death, loss of limbs, total/partial permanent disablement.

CANTEEN

The college has a Canteen on the campus. It is managed by a contractor under the supervision and control of the Management. Most of the items are offered at affordable prices. The contractor can change the prices of the items only in consultation with the Principal/Management. Mess facility is available for the students.

SPECIAL PRIZES

Every year we honour those students who bring fame to our college by their excellent performance in Studies, Sports and other Co-curricular activities.



ANTI - RAGGING MEASURES

As per the norms set by the University of Pune strict action would be taken against the culprits in cases of ragging in our college, hostels etc. These actions would include punishment ranging from fines & warning to filing an F.I.R. and rustication of the culprits depending on the severity of the act of ragging which would be determined by the inquiry conducted by the Anti-Ragging committee in consultation with the Management.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE

The Internal Complaints Committee is constituted as per the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the UGC guidelines.

CARRIER KATTA

It is an Initiative of Department of Higher and Technical Education, Government of Maharashtra and Maharashtra Information Technology Support Centre Government of Maharashtra, recognising the need to equip the students for changing times has come up with an initiative of "Career Katta - करियर कट्टा". Under this initiative different activities are conducted on regular basis.

COURSES

Our college imparts instruction in Arts, Commerce and Science from Std. XI to post-graduate classes in Commerce, English, Economics and Marathi and Ph. D. in Commerce. Specialization at the undergraduate level is available in English, Marathi, Economics, Political Science, Geography and Psychology. We have also introduced 3 year professional degree courses in F. Y. B.Com (B.M.) and F. Y. B.Com (CA). We also run YCMOU's Arts and Commerce Degree Courses at Collage as authorised Center. Information about these courses is available in a separate prospectus for the same

PRIME FEATURES OF NEP 2020:

- The FYUGP is a Choice Based Credit System under Semester Scheme.
- Each course carries a defined number of credits and the credits given against a course implies relative importance of Courses offered.
- The credits earned by a student may be transferred from one institution to other in case of transfer of the student.
- The credits earned by a student will be deposited in Academic Bank of Credits (ABC).
- The programme allows the students to earn credits from MOOCs recognized courses.
- The students shall take part in value-based activities.
- The result of the student is declared on basis of Aggregate Percentage of marks obtained and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) earned.
- The programme allows the students to re-enter the course within a time of 3 years.
- The student has to select a 'major subject' and a 'minor discipline/subject' at the time of admission.
- The candidate has an option to exit after TWO, FOUR and SIX semesters of the programme and shall be awarded Certificate, Diploma, and General Degree, respectively

PH.D. RESEARCH CENTER IN COMMERCE

Subjects offered for Ph.D. are as follows:

1. Business Administration
2. Banking, Finance & Insurance
4. Accountancy and Auditing
5. Business Economics
6. Business Law & Taxation

Eligibility criteria for admission to Ph.D. Programme:

1. Master Degree holder with at least 55% marks or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale or cleared M.Phil. Course with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7 point scale.
2. A relation of 5% of marks, from 55% top 50% shall be allowed for those belonging to reserved categories/Differently-abled and other categories of candidates as per the policies of the Govt. of Maharashtra prescribed from time to time.

Duration of the Programme:

Ph.D. programme shall be of a minimum duration of three years, including course work and a maximum of six years. Extension up to a maximum period of four semesters/two years for Ph.D. shall be given by the Research and Recognition Committee. The women candidates and persons with disability (more than 40% disability) may be allowed an additional relaxation of two years for Ph.D. in the maximum duration.

Procedure for admission to Ph.D. Programme:

1. All admissions for Ph.D. programme shall be through an Entrance Test conducted by SPPU. Candidates qualified in NET/SET/M.Phil./teacher fellowship holders will be exempted from the Entrance Test.
2. The SPPU shall notify well in advance on its website and through advertisement in newspapers.
3. The SPPU shall admit candidates by a two stages process through
 - a) An entrance test which shall be a qualifying test.
 - b) An interview organized by the SPPU

EXAMINATION PATTERN

The College offers Three Year Undergraduate Degree Course, spread out into six / eight semesters, leading to Bachelor's degree in Arts and Commerce and Two Year Post Graduate Degree Course, spread out into four semesters leading to Master's degree in Arts and Commerce. The College is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University and follows the **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) NEP 2020 Structure** introduced by the Government and affiliated University in all the under-graduate and post-graduate courses from the academic year 2024-2025. Two consecutive semesters will make up an academic year. All examinations for F.Y./S.Y./T.Y.B.A./B.Com./M.Com. and M.A. are conducted as per the rules and regulations of the Savitribai Phule Pune University of Pune. Oral examination, Practical's, wherever prescribed, are conducted as per the norms laid down by the Savitribai Phule Pune University.

The Savitribai Phule Pune University has introduced the Choice Cased Credit System under NEP 2020 from the academic year 2024-25. Examination pattern is divided into internal assessment and semester end external examination as per the norms. Internal assessment is based on sessional examinations, home assignments, seminars, projects, group discussions, field trips, assignments, presentations, open book tests, class attendance and notes, etc. At the end of each semester a final external examination is conducted as per the schedule fixed by

the University. The final result of a student will be based on the total marks obtained in both internal and external examinations. Students must pass in both internal and external examinations separately.

A) Post Graduate Examination Pattern for each course: (M.A. / M. Com)

1. Internal assessment
2. Semester end university examination

B) Under Graduate Examination Pattern for each course: (B.A. /B. Com)

3. Internal assessment
4. Semester end university examination

a) A student cannot appear for Semester End Examination unless he / she has maintained at least 75% attendance during the teaching period of that course. If a student fails to maintain attendance up to 75%, at the time of filling of Examination Forms, an undertaking from the student should be taken stating that he / she will be allowed to appear for Examination subject to fulfilment of required attendance criteria during the remaining period of teaching of the course.

b) Each credit will be evaluated for 25 Marks.

c) Each course will have a distribution of 40:60 Marks for CIE and SEE of 4 Credits Course and 20: 30 Marks for CIE and SEE of 2 Credits Course.

d) To pass a course, the student has to obtain at least Forty Percent marks in the CIE and SEE separately.

e) If a student misses CIE examination, he / she will have a Second Chance with the permission of the teacher concerned only. Such a Second Chance shall not be the right of the student; it will be the discretion of the teacher concerned only to give or not to give Second Chance to a student to appear for Internal Assessment.

f) A student cannot register for the Third, Fifth and Seventh Semester, if he / she fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within Two Semesters.

g) No student shall be admitted to the Fifth Semester Examination of the Third Year unless he / she has cleared First Two Semesters.

h) No student shall be admitted to the Fourth Year (Seventh Semester) Degree Program (NEP 2024 Pattern) unless he / she has cleared all the papers of Third and Fourth Semester Examination and has satisfactorily kept terms for the Third Year (Fifth and Sixth Semester).

i) There shall be revaluation of the Answer Scripts of Semester-End Examination but not of Answer Scripts of Internal Assessment Papers as per Ordinance No. 134 A and B.

j) Student may choose Co-curricular course of his/her choice from the basket available to them as per the NEP circulars issued by SPPU, Pune

Verification and Revaluation: The candidate may apply for verification and revaluation or result through Principal of the College which will be done by the University as per ordinance framed in that behalf.

Standard of Passing:

a) A candidate is required to obtain 40% Marks in Internal Assessment, Practical Examination and Semester End University Examination.

- b) It means that passing separately at Internal Assessment, Practical/Project Examination and Semester End University Examination is compulsory.

UNIVERSITY TERMS:

The dates for the commencement and conclusion of the First and the Second Terms shall be as determined by the University Authorities. Only duly admitted students can keep the terms. The present relevant ordinances pertaining to grant of terms will be applicable.

PRACTICAL EXAMINATION

Journal books for Practical examination are issued to students in the Library immediately after college admission. For Choice Base Credit System under NEP 2020 Pattern. Students have to complete the practical's each course and appear for an oral examination of each course in every semester.

RULES OF A.T.K.T.

- i) If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester I shall be allowed to proceed semester II. However, a student who fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits at semester I and II taken together may not be admitted to the second year.
- ii) If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester III shall be allowed to proceed to semester IV.
- iii) If a candidate fails in all the courses (subject heads) of passing of semester V shall be allowed to proceed to semester VI. However, a student who fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits at semester III and IV taken together may not be admitted to the third year
- iv) No candidate shall be allowed to proceed to semester V unless the candidate has cleared semester I & II in all courses (Subjects).
- v) ATKT rules are applicable for 2nd and 4th semester.
- vi) **The present relevant ordinances issued by the SPPU pertaining to ATKT are applicable for all Graduate and Post Graduate courses.**

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

All students of XI / XII & FY / SY / BA / B.Com / B.Com(BM) / B.Com(CA) & M.A / M.Com (Part - I & II) should fill up online admission forms on college website. Students should submit one hard copy of their admission form along with attested Xerox copies of necessary documents.

Admissions are made as per the rules and regulations framed by the Government of Maharashtra and Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune.

ELIGIBILITY

Students passing the H.S.C. Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Higher Secondary Education or equivalent examination of any other statutory Board or University are eligible for admission to the first year of the degree course. Students who have passed the H.S.C. examination from any stream (Arts / Science / Commerce / MCVC) can seek admission to F.Y.B.A./F.Y.B.Com.

Students who have passed B.Com. or equivalent examination of this or any other recognised university are eligible for admission to M.Com Students who have passed B.A. or equivalent examination (with or without Economics/English/Marathi as a special subject) of this or any other recognised university are eligible for admission to M.A. in Economics, English and in Marathi.

Students from a college affiliated to a university other than the University of Pune will have to obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the University of Pune. Students passing B.A., B.Com. or an equivalent examination from Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune or any other university will also have to apply for eligibility while seeking admission to M.A./M.Com. Courses.

- 8) No student shall be admitted to the Fourth Year B.Com BM (Seventh Semester) Degree Program (2024 Pattern) unless he / she has cleared all the papers of Third and Fourth Semester Examination of S.Y. B.Com BM and has satisfactorily kept terms for the Third Year (Fifth and Sixth Semester).
- 9) There shall be revaluation of the Answer Scripts of Semester-End Examination but not of Answer Scripts of Internal Assessment Papers as per Ordinance No. 134 A and B.

Eligibility

- a) No Candidates shall be admitted to the First Year of the B.Com. - CA Degree Program (2024 Pattern) unless he / she has passed the Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination of the Maharashtra State Board or equivalent or University with English as a passing Course.

- b) No candidate shall be admitted to the Third Semester Examination of the Second Year unless he / she has cleared First Two Semesters satisfactorily for the course at the college affiliated to this University.
- c) No student shall be admitted to the Third Year B.Com. – CA (Fifth Semester) Degree Program (2024 Pattern) unless he / she has cleared all the papers of First and Second Semester Examination of F.Y. B.Com. - CA
- d) No candidate shall be admitted to the Fifth Semester Examination of the Third Year unless he / she has cleared the first Two Semesters satisfactorily of Second Year for the Program at the college affiliated to this University.
- e) No candidate shall be admitted to the Fourth Year B. Com. - CA (Seventh Semester) Degree Program (2024 pattern) unless he / she has cleared all the papers of Third and Fourth Semester Examination of S.Y. B.Com.- CA

Examination

- 1) A student cannot appear for the Semester End Examination unless he / she has maintained at least 75% attendance during the teaching period of that course. If a student fails to maintain attendance up to 75%, at the time of filling of Examination Forms, an undertaking from the student should be taken stating that he / she will be allowed to appear for Examination subject to fulfilment of required attendance criteria during the remaining period of teaching of the course.
- 2) Each credit will be evaluated for 25 Marks.
- 3) Each course will have a distribution of 30:70 for CIE and SEE.
- 4) To pass a course, the student must obtain at least 40% Percent marks in the CIE and SEE separately.
- 5) If a student misses CIE examination, he / she will have a Second Chance with the permission of the teacher concerned only. Such a Second Chance shall not be the right of the student; it will be the discretion of the teacher concerned only rather than the Head of the Department or Principal to give or not to give Second Chance to a student to appear for Internal Assessment.
- 6) A student cannot register for the Third, Fifth and Seventh Semester, if he / she fails to complete 50% credits of the total credits expected to be ordinarily completed within Two Semesters.
- 7) No student shall be admitted to the Fifth Semester Examination of the Third Year unless he / she has cleared First Two Semesters.
- 8) No student shall be admitted to the Fourth Year B. Com. - CA (Seventh Semester) Degree Program (2024 Pattern) unless he / she has cleared all the papers of Third and Fourth Semester Examination of S.Y. B. Com. - CA and has satisfactorily kept terms for the Third Year (Fifth and Sixth Semester).
- 9) There shall be revaluation of the Answer Scripts of Semester-End Examination but not of Answer Scripts of Internal Assessment Papers as per Ordinance No. 134 A and B.

In the academic year 2002-2003, we introduced Information Technology as an optional subject in the Junior wing of our college. Curriculum and evaluation pattern for this course have been designed by the State Government of Maharashtra.

4) ADMISSION

 - d) A letter from Deputy Director of Education (for the students seeking transfer from other colleges/schools.)
- Original School Leaving Certificate once submitted will not be returned. Students are, therefore, advised to keep with them sufficient Xerox copies of the same before admission.

4) FEES - Commerce (English Medium)

- i) Admission fee should be paid in one instalment only.
- ii) Library Deposit will have to be paid once only and shall be refunded while leaving college.
- iii) Students offering Information Technology will have to pay additional fees of Rs. 6000/- for Std. XI and Std. XII.
- iv) Education for girls studying in Std. XI and Std. XII is free.

Rules and other details of the above concession schemes shall be displayed on the college Notice-Boards. In case of non-sanction by the Government concerned students will have to pay the entire fee.

5) IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Students must wear their I-Cards without which they will not be allowed to enter the college premises.
- 2) Use of Mobile phones on the College Campus is strictly prohibited.
- 3) Students should preserve all the required receipts.
- 4) As per Govt. rules students will have to participate in one of the following activities.
(i) N. C. C. (ii) N. S. S. (iii) Physical Education.
- 5) All rules and regulations of the college will be applicable to the Higher Secondary students.
- 6) Hostel - Hostel accommodation is available for students of Std. XI & XII. Students in need of hostel accommodation have to apply separately.
- 7) Library - Higher Secondary students are allowed to use the college library and the reading-room.
- 8) Rules regarding admission, fees, discipline and conduct made by the college and the Education Department will be binding on the students.
- 9) 75% attendance is necessary, otherwise the concerned students will not be allowed to appear for the annual examination.
- 10) No student will be allowed to cancel his / her admission unless the required fee for the entire term is paid.
- 11) Admission to Std. XI is given as per the Central Admission System. Admission to Std. XII is given within seven days after the declaration of the result of standard XI.
